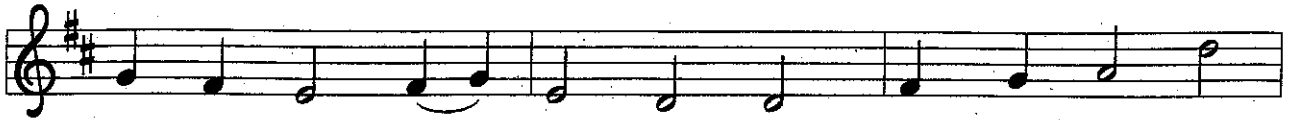

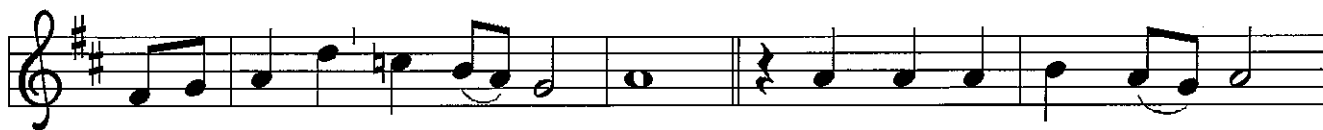

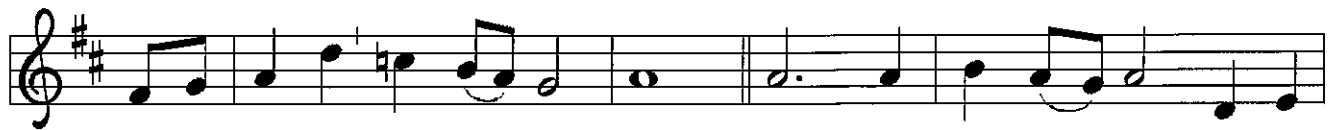

Daniel 7:9-10, 13-14

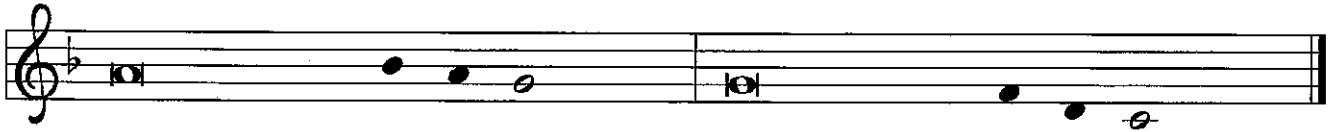
