A Love Supreme, Part 1: Acknowledgement

Throughout John's gospel is the central theme of God's love for the whole world. In this part, Coltrane introduces the theme, "a love supreme," carrying in the bass for most of the song, modulating it through 12 keys, and moving it from saxophone to his voice.

A Love Supreme, Part 2: Resolution

On the night of his betrayal, Jesus speaks to his disciples at length, reassuring them of his love. Having pledged to live according to a love supreme, Coltrane notes in the liner periods of dissonance and irresolution that were resolved by the mercy of God.

A Love Supreme, Part 3: Pursuance

Jesus is betrayed, arrested, "tried," and sentenced, ever resolute despite the chaos around him. As the group slides into the blues pocket, the music gains complexity, building tension toward the final part of the album.

A Love Supreme, Part 4: Psalm

Jesus's death is the ultimate completion of his purpose. The final movement is the musical representation of a poem written by Coltrane, each note a syllable, a full expression of Coltrane's faith that a love supreme is all and everything.

Silence is kept.
